Lake Ashton (LW) CDD News

Hurricane Irma packed a punch but Lake Ashton stood strong before, during and after the storm. Many neighbors offered to help others with garage storage (for vehicles), generators, and other generous offers while storm preparations were underway. Residents stocked up on supplies, gasoline, and ice and then braced for electrical outages, wind, and rain. Thankfully, the community fared very well with relatively minor damage and minimal power outages. The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) and Amateur Radio Club activated after the storm but, again, there were very few incidents to report to local public safety organizations. Neighbors were quick to lend a hand (or a chainsaw) to assist with cleaning up downed trees and other vegetation in residential yards. All of the Clubhouse amenities were up and running within hours of the storm passing so it was a truly remarkable recovery. Of course, there were some damages to LA (LW) CDD property such as roof, shade awning, signage, soffit, and exterior fencing. In some cases, repairs are already completed but others will take longer to finish.

LA (LW) CDD Supervisors met September 8 and approved renewing agreements for landscaping, janitorial services, pond maintenance, and pool cleaning services. Supervisors also approved grout and laminate work in the Clubhouse Fitness Center restrooms. The Clubhouse Fitness Center showers will be closed from October 13 to October 23. During certain days, there may be limited or no access to the Fitness Center restrooms while workers are present.

#### **Help Keep Lake Ashton Secure**

Anyone using amenities (such as the Pools, Cinema, Bowling Alley, Fitness Centers, Tennis Courts, etc.) at the Clubhouse or HFC should have a Lake Ashton Resident Identification or Guest Pass. This identification policy helps staff and security officers ensure that the amenities are safeguarded and being used as intended. Please get in the habit of bringing Lake Ashton Identification with each visit to the Clubhouse or HFC. With many new residents moving to the expanding neighborhood, a Lake Ashton photo ID assists staff and security officers with learning names and faces. Keep in mind, if staff or security ask for an identification, it is not to harass residents, but rather intended to keep the neighborhood secure.

Those who have not yet received an identification can check with Clubhouse staff for an application and the times when the camera and equipment is set up. Lake Ashton identification qualifies residents to participate in a Resident Discount program where over 55 local business, restaurants, and services offer a Lake Ashton Resident Discount. Lake Wales Police Department and Lake Ashton Community Development District have teamed up in a safety initiative to prevent golf carts and other vehicles from driving and parking on the sidewalk and on the road in front of the bank. Not only is it in violation of city ordinances, but parking on the sidewalks is also extremely dangerous for residents and guests accessing the bank, Sales Office, Resales Office or MX Communications office. Hopefully, drivers notice a No Parking sign in the vicinity of the sidewalk and road in front of the Sales Office/bank building. The sign was placed here to discourage all vehicles, including golf carts, from parking on the sidewalk or the road. Please assist in making Lake Ashton sidewalks and roads safe for residents and guests by not parking on the sidewalk or the road in this congested area.

#### LA (LW) HOA - Texas Phoenix Palm Decline

Many of Lake Ashton's palm trees are being hit by Texas Phoenix palm decline (TPPD), a fatal, systemic disease that kills palms relatively quickly and is spread naturally to palms by sap-feeding insects, such as planthoppers. Currently, the known susceptible hosts for the TPPD phytoplasma are Phoenix canariensis (Canary Island date palm), Phoenix dactylifera (edible date palm), Phoenix sylvestris (wild date palm), Sabal palmetto (cabbage palm), Phoenix reclinata, Sabal palmetto, and Syagrus romanzoffiana (queen palm).

Palms showing symptoms of more than 25 percent foliar discoloration or a dead spear leaf due to the disease should be removed as soon as possible. Death of the spear leaf indicates the apical meristem (bud) has died, so no new growth will occur. Although lower leaves may remain green for a number of months after the spear leaf dies, it is in the best interest of the community to remove the infectious palm as soon as possible. The diseased palm serves as a source of the phytoplasma that can be transmitted by an insect vector to still-healthy, TPPDsusceptible palms. If TPPD symptoms are present, but the spear leaf has not died, therapeutic treatment of the disease may be achieved by application of the antibiotic oxytetracycline HCl (often referred to as OTC), administered to palms by liquid injection into the trunk. Treatments would continue for the life of the palm on a three- to four-month treatment schedule. Contact the HOA office for more information at 863.325.0065.
