Lake Ashton (LW) CDD News

Lake Ashton (Lake Wales) CDD Supervisors met January 12 and approved the proposal for replacing the Pavilion roof damaged by Hurricane Irma. Construction will begin when the Clubhouse roofing project is complete. The Board also authorized staff to move forward with replacement of all fluorescent bulbs in the Clubhouse with LED bulbs. The installation of LED light bulbs in all Clubhouse fixtures will save on electricity costs and an application for TECO rebates was approved which will allow for even more cost savings for the District. Residents will notice a heightened LWPD presence at Lake Ashton. Be sure to follow all posted road signs. All vehicles must obey all stop signs and the 20 mph speed limit throughout Lake Ashton. Drivers, please keep an eye out for pedestrians at all times. Obeying posted speed limit and traffic signs can help avert a potential tragedy.

The RFP for bidding out Amenity Management Services is being finalized and will be discussed further during the February 9 Board of Supervisor's Meeting, held at 9 a.m. in the Clubhouse Ballroom. All residents are encouraged to attend. A joint meeting with LACDD and LAIICDD Supervisors will be held Friday, February 9 at 11 a.m. in the Clubhouse Ballroom. The LAIICDD Board of Supervisors will meet at 1:30 p.m. in the HFC Community Center.

Through the beginning of February, workers will be on-site at the Lake Ashton Clubhouse for roof construction. Be alert to workers, equipment, and dumpsters. At certain times, some parking areas or building access may be unavailable. Be respectful of safety cones and caution tape in construction zones. Help Keep Lake Ashton Secure

Anyone using amenities at the Clubhouse or HFC should have a Lake Ashton Resident Identification card or a facilities Guest Pass. This identification policy helps staff and security officers ensure that the amenities are safeguarded and being used as intended. With many new residents moving to the expanding neighborhood, a Lake Ashton photo ID assists staff and security officers with learning names and faces. Keep in mind, if staff or security ask for an identification, it is not to harass residents, but rather intended to keep the neighborhood secure. Those who have not yet received an identification can check with Clubhouse staff for an application and the times when the camera and equipment is set up. Lake Ashton identification qualifies residents to participate in a discount program where over 55 local business, restaurants, and services offer a Lake Ashton Resident Discount. View a detailed list on ashtonliving.net on the Lake Ashton Resident Identification Discount Program page under the Resident Services tab, or at the Clubhouse Activities Desk.

All guests and renters must be registered and have a facilities Guest Pass to use Clubhouse Amenities. To register, residents must bring at least one adult guest to the Clubhouse Activities Desk Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., or with the seasonal Pool Security Officer at the Clubhouse Pool Saturdays and Sundays from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. (weather permitting) and renters must have a copy of their rental agreement. Registration cannot be completed in advance.

Directory Information Update Request

The Lake Ashton Resident Directory is available at the Activities Desk (updated in December). The cost is \$2 and they can be purchased Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. With many residents getting new telephone and internet service providers, phone numbers and email addresses may have changed. Please take a moment to look at the printed directory or go to ashtonliving.net, click on the "Stay Connected" tab, and go to the resident directory to verify the information for your listing is correct. If any discrepancies are found please complete the directory update sheet located at the Activities Desk or send an email with the correct contact information to admin@lakeashtoncdd.com.

One important feature of the online resident directory is the opportunity to list emergency contact information. If you know that your emergency contact(s) have gotten a new phone number, please update their information on your listing. Having regularly updated contact information will help in case of a health emergency, accident, or other residential incident. Important Parking Information

Parking can become scarce during high attendance events at Lake Ashton. Please consider carpooling (or cartpooling) to Monday Coffee, Bingo, shows, and other popular activities. When driving a golf cart to the amenities, please save spaces

by parking at least two carts in parking spaces designed for cars. When parking along the curb in front of the Clubhouse or Health and Fitness Center, please pull up with both front tires to the curb to maximize designated golf cart parking.

The sales office parking lot is not owned by LACDD but the building/parking lot owner makes the lot available for parking for LACDD residents and guests. However, there needs to be enough space for customers and employees to park. The owner is designating the east row as parking for employees and guests during regular business hours. Residents will be subject to being towed if they park in the wrong area during business hours. For after hours (evenings) it is okay for residents and guests to use both sides of the parking lot.

Neighborhood Watch - What to Watch For When Suspecting a Crime

Anything can happen in the blink of an eye and sometimes what a witness or victim sees and remembers can be crucial in helping law enforcement solve the crime. When you call 9-1-1, you will be asked various questions. If you saw someone commit a crime, do you think you could accurately describe what they looked like or what they were driving?

Important Description Information:

- Gender, ethnicity, approximate age, height, weight, build, hair style and color, eye color, facial hair, jewelry, tattoos, glasses or anything else that would assist in identifying the person.
- Type and colors of clothing any hat, shirt, jacket, pants, shorts, dress, belt, and shoes?

Describing a Vehicle:

- License plate, bumper stickers or damage, colors, year (or year range), or people in vehicle.
- Jotting this information down ASAP (in your phone or on paper) will help refresh your memory as needed to assist law enforcement.






