VISITING LAKE ASHTON?

Please remember that anyone using amenities at the Clubhouse or HFC should have a Lake Ashton Resident Identification card or a facilities Guest Pass.

To register guests, residents must bring at least one adult guest to the Clubhouse Activities Desk Monday —Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., or with the seasonal Pool Security Officer at the Clubhouse Pool Saturdays and Sundays from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. (weather permitting). Renters must have rental agreement.

Resident Identification cards are printed at the Clubhouse Activities Desk Tuesdays from 9:30 - 11:30 a.m. and 3 - 5 pm, Wednesdays from 3 - 5 pm, and Thursdays from 3 - 5 pm.

Residents, please be tolerant of extra activity at the pool and other amenities. Those hosting family should remind them to be considerate of residents in this 55 and older community. It is helpful if a resident accompanies their guests at any of the amenities.

Please shower before entering Lake Ashton pools or spas. Do not eat or drink while in the pool or spa, including sitting on the side of pool or spa. Florida health codes do not allow for any beverages (even bottled water) to be in the wet pool deck (the four foot perimeter around the entire pool and spa).



WILDLIFE ALERT: WATCH FOR ALLIGATORS

Now that the weather has warmed up, cold-blooded

reptiles such as alligators can be more active. Be cautious when having fun in and around water. If you have concerns with an alligator that poses a threat to humans, pets or property, call the FWC's Nuisance Alligator Hotline at 866-FWC-GATOR. It is illegal to feed or harass alligators.

REMINDERS

- Golf carts should be driven only by those 14 years and older.
- Fishing is permitted but anyone over 16 years of age must have a valid Florida fishing license (exemptions listed on myfwc.com), and there is a catch and release policy for Districtowned lake/retention ponds.

Lake Ashton II (WH) CDD News

February has been a very busy month for LAIICDD Board and staff with numerous meetings that deal with issues that impact not only those friends and neighbors on the West but the entire community. On February 9 the LAIICDD Board met in a joint meeting with the LACDD (Lake Wales). There was a lot of discussion and agreement that both boards need to communicate with each other to provide residents with a "seamless, transparent and holistic" approach to dealing with the operation of the entire Lake Ashton community. The topic that was discussed that has drawn a lot of interest and



concern by many in the community is the availability of the golf courses and other property currently owned by the developer, Mr. Maxwell. This topic is still in its earliest stages of evaluation, analysis, and consideration by both Boards. As this affects the entire community, a joint effort is being started by representatives of both CDDs. Doug Robertson (LAIICDD) and Carol Pontius (LACDD) will be responsible for the comprehensive evaluation of the situation. Part of that process will be a financial analysis, as well as an operational analysis to ensure that whichever option is adopted will have the least impact upon residents while insuring the Lake Ashton community remains the vibrant and attractive community that it is. An integral part of that effort will be forums where residents may voice their opinions and concerns to the respective boards prior to any final decision. There are many rumors concerning this and can only advise that if you did not hear it from an official board communique, it is just rumor. Your Board will keep you abreast of the official details and there is no need for concern at this time. The LAIICDD Board met following the joint meeting and a lot of business was discussed and handled in those areas specific to the Winter Haven side. A discussion was held regarding the requirements of the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFMD) in dealing with the cutting of vegetation around the lakes within the LAIICDD authority. While the district must remain in compliance by law, there were some concerns by affected residents who have asked for LAIICDD assistance in obtaining a variance to some of the requirements and the Board agreed to do so. The continued repair of the windows in the Fitness Center due to water incursion was approved. The already approved installation of French doors in the Community Center will also be taking place. Enhancement of the Wi-Fi capabilities within the HFC was approved which will increase coverage for residents using electronic devices in and around the HFC. Your Board and staff continue to diligently work to make Lake Ashton II, as well as the entire Lake Ashton Community, the outstanding place that it is to live in!
