The LACDD Board of Supervisors met May 11 and approved the purchase of two new beer coolers for the Clubhouse Restaurant, and a three-year pricing agreement extension for propane gas at the Clubhouse. Supervisors also approved the Ballroom window replacement capital improvement project and work will begin soon. Please stay tuned to media announcing construction zones and potential closures of the Clubhouse Ballroom. After the meeting, a joint meeting with LAIICDD was held to address matters that affect the community as a whole. One of the agenda items was the status of golf course negotiations. Both districts voted unanimously to enter into an agreement with National Golf Foundation, an independent professional consultant specializing in valuation analysis of golf courses, to help with the decision-making process. Information will be distributed to residents via electronic media as it is received, so please be sure all contact information on ashtonliving.net is up-todate. Also discussed was the implementation of a common amenity policy among the districts including what the definition of a guest is. Supervisor Costello (LACDD) and Supervisor Williams (LAIICDD) were chosen to work with both Community Directors to accomplish this goal. Both Community Directors were also tasked with generating a resident feedback survey that encompasses amenities and services provided at both facilities.

Lake Ashton II (WH) CDD News

As the LACDD and LAIICDD continue to work towards a united community, much effort is required to help residents feel the WE (West/East)-R-1 philosophy! The Joint Board meeting May 11 tasked both Community Directors to work with designated Board members to accomplish two specific tasks relating to this effort. The current amenities policies for both CDDs, which share many things in common already, will be reviewed, and the goal is to create one policy with the caveats specific to the West or East listed at the end. LAIICDD Supervisor Stan Williams and LACDD Supervisor Mike Costello will work with both community directors on this. Second, the community directors will work to develop a combined Annual Community Feedback Survey to simplify and provide the very best in community service for residents.

The annual cleaning contract with Magic Genie was renewed at the LAIICDD Board of Supervisors meeting on May 11. Supervision of the Securitas staff and Yellowstone staff was discussed and will be revisited. The dumpster at the HFC will be changed out for a bigger one (two extra cubic feet) with the monthly fee remaining the same. Residents are not allowed to bring any of their residential refuse to this dumpster at any time or for any reason. If you see someone doing so, please contact the HFC Activities Desk.

A new, easier to understand budget format is in process for fiscal year 2019, under the direction of Supervisor Carla Wright. The District Management contract sent out in April was awarded to Governmental Management Services LLC, under the direction of President Darrin Mossing and District Manager Jill Burns. The District legal services contract was awarded to the firm of Latham, Shuker, Eden & Beaudine, LLP. Looking forward to working with these fine individuals.

Help Keep Lake Ashton Secure

Anyone using Lake Ashton amenities should have a valid Lake Ashton Resident Photo Identification card or a facilities Guest Pass. This identification policy helps staff and security officers ensure that the amenities are safeguarded and being used as intended. If staff or security ask for identification, it is not to harass residents, but is intended to keep the neighborhood secure. Resident Photo Identification cards are the property of Lake Ashton Community Development District and should be surrendered if moving from the community. ID cards are printed at the Clubhouse Activities Desk Tuesdays between 9:30 and 11:30 a.m. and 3 to 5 p.m., Wednesdays from 3 to 5 p.m., and Thursdays from 3 to 5 p.m. Guests can be registered at the Clubhouse Activities Desk between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, and 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Saturday. Residents must bring at least one adult guest to register, and renters must have a copy of their rental agreement.

Hurricane Season Begins & Lightning Safety

Hurricane season begins June 1. All residents should prepare for severe weather. There is a handout at the Clubhouse Activities Desk and online at ashtonliving.net with information and helpful storm preparedness tips. Attend a storm preparedness presentation at Monday Coffee on June 4 at 9 a.m. for information on how to prepare for severe weather and how to stay safe during and after a storm. Historically the Florida Legislature approves of a tax holiday for hurricane preparation items such as generators, batteries, and flashlights. For 2018 the dates will be June 1 through June 7.

Lake Ashton is fortunate to have a lightning detection system that covers the entire community. The system is not just to let golfers know when they should get off the course, but also notifies all residents that they should go indoors when the potential for a lightning strike is in the area. When the system senses a lightning danger, a high-pitched siren sounds and strobe lights turn on and stay on until the danger passes. These strobe lights are at various locations including on top of the Clubhouse, the backside of the HFC and at the boat dock on Lake Ashton. When the danger of lightning has passed, a low-pitched horn will sound the all clear and the strobe lights will turn off. Be safe and remember that lightning strikes may occur far away from a visible storm. Get out of pools, do not stand under trees, and get indoors when the siren sounds. Please remember that golf carts are not safe from lightning.

Pool & Spa Friendly Reminders

Please do not eat or drink while in the pools or spa, including sitting on the side of pool or spa. Florida health codes do not allow for any beverages (even bottled water) to be in the wet pool deck which is the four foot perimeter around the entire pool and spa. Please enjoy food and beverages (in non-breakable containers only - no glass) at the tables and / or chairs. Please shower before entering Lake Ashton pools or spas. Only those aged 13 years and older should enjoy the spas. Please put down pool umbrellas when leaving the pool area to avoid potential damage caused by wind. Those hosting family should remind them to be considerate of residents in this 55 and older community. Before entering the area, children should be reminded to walk on the pool deck as running is always prohibited It is helpful (but not required) if residents accompany guests. Guests under 18 should always be accompanied by an adult.

Wildlife Alert - Watch for Alligators

Now that the weather has warmed up, cold-blooded reptiles such as alligators can be more active. Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) reminds residents to be cautious when having fun in and around water. The FWC recommends keeping pets away from the water. Residents who have concerns with an alligator that poses a threat to humans, pets or property, call the FWC's Nuisance Alligator Hotline at 866.FWC.GATOR (392-4286). Alligators and crocodiles are an important part of Florida's heritage and play a valuable role in the ecosystems where they live. It is illegal to feed or harass alligators. Neighborhood Watch (NW) — Sprucing Up for Crime Prevention

- Trim the trees and bushes around your home (windows and doors should be clear and visible from the street).
- Lock pet doors unless in use by your pet (this accessory is an open door for a burglar to access your home).
- Consider purchasing a safe for cash and jewelry (only give location of items to trusted people who need to know)
- Avoid home-improvement scams/deception burglaries (never let door-to-door solicitors inside your home).
- Summer vacation plans? Don't announce it on Facebook! (post pictures after you return). You never know who sees your announcement that your home will be vacant for a period of time).
- Request a drive by, while you are away, from your Neighborhood Watch Coordinator, CAP Partner or a trusted neighbor. While driving buy they can notice any unusual activity and contact the appropriate law enforcement group.

Make Sure You're Informed Register for Polk County's Public Safety Notification System

You can get immediate public safety notifications during emergencies or threatening situations on your smartphone, tablet, home phone, email, text and social media. Time-critical notifications include:

- Tornadoes/severe weather
- Mandatory evacuations
 Boil water orders
- Gas leaks
- Sexual predator relocation notices
- Critical law enforcement notices
- Hurricanes and hurricane recovery information

To register for Alert Polk, go to **alertpolk.com** or through the county's website at **polk-county.net**. Click on the Alert Polk button in the top right corner of the home page. When you register to receive notifications, please be aware that phone carrier charges may apply for all alert messages and data. You will only receive alerts that affect the address(es) you register.

"Alert Polk" is part of "Alert Florida." the state's critical communications system shared with most public safety operations across the state.

New Lake Ashton Phone & Text Messaging System

Citizens Assisted Patrol (CAP)

While on patrol in the development, it is apparent that residents and visitors should remember to walk facing oncoming traffic. Many in the community have reduced hearing and bikes, golf carts, and electric cars don't make too much noise. You also want to know if there is a large truck coming your way. All drivers should also obey all posted speed limit signs (20 mph) and stop signs, and keep an eye out for pedestrians.

CAP and Neighborhood Watch are the eyes and ears of Lake Ashton. They are not law enforcement but observe and report only. They do not carry a gun or taser; they use a cell phone if they see something suspicious or help is needed. CAP is made up of men and women volunteers who reside in Lake Ashton, year round or seasonally. Last year CAP had over 3,500 patrol hours. LA (LW) ARC: We See What You Wrote — What Did You Mean?

The Architectural Review Committee (ARC) receives many requests for changes to owners' lots. The community covenants and rules require all changes to the exterior of your property be submitted for approval. The ARC is here to help you and your neighbors comply with the covenants and keep Lake Ashton looking and living great. But, many times these requests are not clear. For example: "We request approval to 'pour concrete around flower beds in back." Can you tell what that owner is asking for? Can you picture a three-foot wide and two-inch high concrete ring around the flower beds in the back of the house? Or how about concrete on the entire back yard except for the flower beds? The ARC believes both ideas are possible, but neither might be correct.

When you submit an ARC request, it would be of great help to the ARC if you submit with full information. That includes the size, dimensions, and location of the project, in addition to describing the materials and color. Please note that the ARC request form requires that you submit a request that allows your ARC to determine exactly what changes you want to make without visiting your property or talking further with you. However, your ARC representative will probably contact you anyway. Your ARC request must include a description of your proposed project in words and more. Your ARC request must include a scale map of your property showing all existing landscape features, all buildings and showing where your additions or change will be done. ARC representatives can help you submit a complete application. Contact the representative for your area (you can find at ashtonliving.net or by sending an email to arc@lakeashtonhoa.org). This complete request will be protection for you if and when in the future the rules change. Under changed rules, your project may become non-compliant. With an exact picture and description of what the ARC approved for you there will be an accurate record in your property files that you complied with rules in place at the time of your request. To find exactly what is approved thus far on your property, go to ashtonliving.net and sign in with your username and password. Click on "home" in the top upper left hand corner, and you will find a menu of the HOA information filed under your name.

To keep this community as safe, enjoyable, and accessible as possible for everyone, all residents and guests in motor vehicles and golf carts should observe and practice the no parking policy under the Clubhouse porte-cochère (covered portion of the stone paved driveway). Please help maintain clear traffic lanes at the Clubhouse at all times so emergency vehicles and neighbors with limited mobility can have quick and easy access when needed. Loading and unloading is permitted on a limited basis and should be done so as quickly as possible. All golf carts parking elsewhere on the front driveway should only park with both front wheels to the curb towards the Clubhouse, not parallel to it, to allow as much room as possible for others to park. Do not park at any time on the opposite curb nearest the fountain. Please observe the No Stopping or Parking signs in front of the bank/sales office. This applies to all motor vehicles and golf carts on both the street and the sidewalk This is one of the community's busiest and highest traffic locations and stopping and parking at this location can create very hazardous conditions for pedestrians and vehicles traversing this area. Parking is available in the parking lot west of the sales office or on either side of the Clubhouse.

Pet Play Parks

All dogs are welcome to play at the park. If you choose to visit the park, please be aware that the park is for all sized pet at all times and many different types and sizes of dogs may be visiting at the same time. All pets, whatever size, are to be closely supervised at all times. When your dog defecates at the park or anywhere in Lake Ashton other than your own yard, you are required to clean it up and remove it immediately. Not doing so can be a health hazard to people and other animals and also violates Polk County ordinance CO1-001, where fines can apply. Bags are located by the Clubhouse Tennis Courts and Pet Parks. Lake Ashton is a pet friendly community, so being a responsible pet owner will help keep it that way. Additionally, the following is taken from the Amenities Policies: Dogs and all other pets (with the

exception of service dogs) are not permitted at the Amenity Facilities. In the event a special event is held, as previously approved by the Amenity Manager, and dogs are permitted at the Amenity Facilities as part of the special event, they must be leashed. Patrons are responsible for picking up after all pets and disposing of any waste in a designated pet waste receptacle or an outdoor dumpster as a courtesy to residents.

The Pebble Beach Park has reopened. The same rules and regulation apply to this park as in the Winged Foot Lane Park. Designated pet parks are places for pets to socialize and play and are not to be used as public toilets or for pet grooming activities. All pet owners are responsible for monitoring their pets' behavior and ensuring a clean environment. If anyone notices pet owners not adhering to these policies, kindly inform them of these rules. Repeated offenders or any aggressive pets may be asked to leave the park.

It is recommended that owners acclimate new or visiting pets to the park when other pets are not present. Pets respond better to a new environment when they don't feel threatened or attacked. As you begin to introduce your pet to others, notify owners before entering the park so special attention is provided to ensure a smooth transition.
