Lake Ashton Community Development Board of Supervisors met November 19 and recognized Supervisors Carol Pontious and Brenda Van Sickle for eight years of dedicated service to the Lake Ashton Community as this was their last meeting as Supervisors. The board discussed and approved a quote to repair a stormwater pipe at the intersection of Birkdale and Dunmore. Residents will be informed of any changes in traffic patterns as a result of construction. The second phase of Bocce Ball Court refurbishment was approved and residents will notice new carpeting and scoring systems soon. The board also approved an upgrade to the Clubhouse Wi-Fi system including new access points being installed and an additional access point installed in the hallway near the Bowling Alley, Craft and Card Rooms. A treatment plan for the medjool date palms on Lake Ashton Blvd. was also approved. This will help to prevent a potentially fatal disease from damaging the costly palms. There will be a joint CDD meeting on Tuesday, December 4 at 10 a.m. in the HFC Community Center to discuss developments regarding the golf course and any other items requested by either Board. Please trust that Supervisors have the best interests of residents in the forefront and are willing to listen to all resident comments regarding subjects that affect the entire community. Prior to the joint CDD meeting, new and returning supervisors for LACDD will be sworn in at 9:30 a.m. followed by new and returning supervisors for LAIICDD being sworn in at 9:45 a.m. Residents are encouraged to attend to gain first hand information and get any questions answered.

# Family In Town? Friendly Reminders for a Safe and Happy Holiday Season

December is a traditional time for family and friends to escape the cold up north and come to visit those lucky enough to live at Lake Ashton. Remember that visiting grandchildren are guests of your neighbors, so please extend every courtesy possible, and be tolerant of extra activity at the pool and other amenities. Those hosting family should remind them to be considerate of residents in this 55 and older community. It is helpful if residents accompany their guests at any of the amenities.

Golf carts should be driven only by those 14 years and older. It is helpful if residents accompany young people driving golf carts. Adults should not place young children on their laps between them and the steering wheel as this creates a hazardous condition for the children in the case of a panic stop or accidents. All vehicles, including golf carts, must obey all stop signs and the 20 mph speed limit throughout Lake Ashton. Drivers, please keep an eye out for pedestrians at all times. Obeying posted speed limit and traffic signs can help avert a potential tragedy. The shortest day of the year, the Winter Solstice, is December 21. When walking or bicycling, especially at night, remember to "Be Safe and Be Seen: Make Yourself Visible to Drivers."

Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) reminds residents to be cautious when having fun in and around water. The FWC recommends keeping pets 10' away from the water. For residents who have concerns with an alligator that poses a threat to humans, pets or property, call the FWC's Nuisance Alligator Hotline at 866-FWC-GATOR (392-4286). Remember, it is illegal to feed or harass alligators.

# **Golf Cart Parking**

The parking lot spaces are sized for fitting two carts in one space, so please park on only one half of a parking space in the parking lot to allow for better use of the area.

# **Neighborhood Watch – Holiday Shopping Tips**

You can play a key role in preventing crime during the very busy shopping month!

- Shop with family or friends. There is safety in numbers!
- If shopping while dark, park in a well-lit area. Avoid poorly lighted sections of parking lots.
- Lock your packages in the trunk and consider taking a quick trip home to unload periodically.
- Keep vehicle doors locked and windows closed.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash. Pay for purchases with check, debit or credit card.
- Try to avoid ATM machines if at all possible.
- Don't try to carry too many packages to your vehicle. If needed, make multiple trips to not be overburdened leaving the opportunity of being caught off guard and vulnerable.
- Be aware of surroundings. If you see something suspicious, call 9-1-1 immediately!
- Shopping with grandchildren? Take their picture using your phone just before leaving the house so you have the most updated photo including clothing description in case you get separated.

They do not carry a gun or taser; they use a cell phone if they see something suspicious or help is needed. CAP is made up of men and women volunteers residing in Lake Ashton, year round or seasonally. Last year CAP had over 3,500 patrol hours. Election of directors takes place at the annual meeting in February, but there will be no nominations accepted at the annual meeting. Members who wish to run must be nominated at the December Board of Directors meeting. That nominating meeting date will be announced to all members. Any member may nominate any other member of the Lake Ashton (LW) HOA or may nominate himself or herself. Nominees must accept the nomination and agree to run for the office of director. You should note that if there are no more nominees that positions available on the board, according to Florida Statute, there need not be an election. There will be an election only if there are more nominees than positions available. # **Residential Yard Waste**

The "claw truck" services Lake Ashton on Thursdays. Call the 863.665.1489 if your pile is larger than the bed of a pickup truck. Items such as tree limbs, tree trunks, palm fronds, etc. shall be cut in lengths no greater than four foot long, if



the item's diameter is less than six inches: and shall be cut in lengths no greater than two foot long if the item's diameter is six inches or greater.

Professional tree service companies are responsible for disposing of the residents debris. Grass cuttings, weeds, leaves, and other yard material must be placed in containers, bags, or bundles. No single item shall exceed fifty (50) pounds in weight.

Residents with a lawn service coming on Friday, Saturday, Sunday, Monday, or Tuesday have two choices to dispose of yard waste. The lawn service either removes the yard waste at the time of service, or the lawn service places the yard waste in the residents' side yard toward the rear of the property; the resident must then place the yard waste at the curb on Wednesday or Thursday. If your lawn service is unable to perform either job, the resident should consider a new lawn service. The Lake Ashton HOA Rules are very specific: no yard waste at curbside more than 48 hours before Friday pickup.

# **Safeguard Storm Drains**

Residents who have lawn and landscaping trimming should never place loose vegetation on top of storm drains. Loose vegetation can fall or blow into the storm drain and clog


