# REMINDERS

### **Respect the Wet Pool Deck**

Please do not eat or drink while in the pools or spa, including sitting on the side of pool or spa. Florida health codes do not allow for any beverages (even bottled water) to be in the **wet pool deck (the fourfoot perimeter around the entire pool and spa)**. Please enjoy food and beverages (in non-breakable containers only — no glass) at the tables and/or chairs. All alcoholic beverages must be purchased at NiNi's. Please shower before entering Lake Ashton pools or spas. Only those aged 13 years and older should enjoy the spas. Please put down pool umbrellas when leaving the pool area to avoid potential damage caused by wind. Those hosting family should remind them to be considerate of residents in this 55 and older community. Before entering the area, children should be reminded to walk on the pool deck as running is always prohibited. It is helpful (but not required) if residents accompany guests.

# **Resident Feedback and Repair Forms**

Your experiences in the community are meant to be as pleasant and memorable as possible. Please take a minute to let staff know how they are doing. A Resident Feedback form can be found at either Activities Desk. Please be sure to complete the contact information so staff may follow-up if requested. Also, if any of the Clubhouse or surrounding amenities are found to be in need of repair or freshening up please let staff know by completing a Repair Request form and turning in at the Clubhouse Activities Desk. These forms are also located in a rounder at the Clubhouse Activities Desk.

# LACDD NEWS

The LACDD Board of Supervisors met on August 19 and approved a few projects at the Clubhouse. Repairs to the ellipticals in the Fitness Center were approved in addition to some dormer repairs at the Gate House. The Board also approved of a State of Florida flag to be added to the stage along with the American flag and POW/MIA flag. Staff is ordering a pole and stand and it will be on display soon. The Lake Ashton Woodworkers will also be working on taking apart the current rounders on the Clubhouse Activities Desk to hang them on the wall near the Ballroom Kitchen. This will open up the desk and allow for residents to be helped in a more efficient manner. Supervisors also approved the replacement of three doors at the Clubhouse (the northwest and southwest entrances and restaurant patio closet) in the coming months. Dance floor refurbishment will also take place in September. Residents will be notified of any closures due to these projects. The next Joint CDD Board of Supervisors meeting will be on Friday, September 27 at 11 am in the Clubhouse Ballroom. The agenda for this meeting will include consideration of the Joint Amenity Policy and will be posted on ashtonliving.net on September 20. All residents are encouraged to attend the LACDD, LAIICDD, and Joint CDD meetings to obtain first-hand information and express concerns and/or obtain answers to questions concerning the community.

Residents will notice a new "No Vehicle Parking" sign by the circular driveway at the Clubhouse. There should never be an unoccupied vehicle left in this driveway as this area should be clear at all times for emergency vehicle access. If a resident leaves a vehicle in this area, staff and/or security will ask them to park in one of the parking lots on the side of the building. There are convenient entrances to the Clubhouse from the east and west parking lots.

There were over 30 new residents at the most recent New Resident Social at the Clubhouse. As many new residents are welcomed to the community, there is higher demand than ever for tickets and reservations for activities. Over 85 tickets were sold to residents on the first day of ticket sales for the Dog Days of Summer and Liverpool Live events! Please get in the habit of bringing a Lake Ashton identification when coming to the Clubhouse to purchase tickets, register guests, or use any of the amenities. This identification will help staff to offer quicker, more efficient service. In this edition of the LA Times residents will notice a wide variety of upcoming activities. In order to provide residents with first choice seating, ticketed events such as shows and bus trips are open to residents only for a certain period of time, and then residents will be able to purchase tickets for their registered guests at a date closer to the event if space allows. If an event is not yet open to registered guests, residents can ask to be added to a waiting list at the Activities Desk. Fiscal year 2019 is coming to an end this month, and the year's projects are finishing up as designated by the LAIICDD Board of Supervisors. The Board

approved the completion of the window shutters in the Community Center at the August 9th meeting so the final shutters have been ordered. Many thanks to Kay Prusiecki for her generous donation towards finishing this project. The shutters should arrive sometime in late September.

Also, quotes are in for the new sidewalk between the parking lot to the north of the HFC and the HFC building so that project will be well under way by the time this article is read.



Another dead tree has been removed from the Boulevard and both dead tree stumps have been ground out and white crepe myrtles planted. There is yet another dead/dying palm (first one at the Hwy. 653 West Gate Entrance), so that will be removed also. Supervisor Zelazny is working hard to complete refurbishing plans for the the Boulevard.

Lightning hit the HFC pool area on August 9. First and foremost, no one was injured as a result of the lightning hit. The resulting damaged services are being replaced with coverage by insurance and a lot of hard work by the Maintenance team of James Margeson and Chuck Yeager. Research is being compiled for costs involving lightning prevention as the HFC will remain the tallest building in the area. The LAIICDD Board of Supervisors continues to be proactive and protective stewards for Lake Ashton. As of this writing, talks will continue regarding the purchase/no purchase of the golf courses. By publication of this newsletter, much more information will be known and shared at the September LAIICDD Board of Supervisors' meeting. Staff continues to welcome suggestions, so please take advantage of the Suggestion Box located outside of the Community Director's office in the Media Center. Remember however, all suggestions must have your name included on them to be considered.

Get ready to "see pink" in October at the HFC, as activities are being planned, donations gathered, and competition for the most pink worn to the most events will be held. October is National Breast Cancer Awareness month. Residents are also encouraged to bring ideas to staff for awareness events for other forms of cancer.

Six Tips to Reinforce Your Home During Hurricane Season:

If left unprotected, a hurricane will no doubt cause severe damage to your home. Follow these steps before the storm to protect your home and help limit storm damage (both inside and out):

• Trim trees and shrubs and make sure your rain gutters are clear. This will reduce the amount of loose debris that can damage your home when the winds pick up. **NOTE:** If you have a large pile of yard waste, please call Republic Services on Wednesday (863.665.1489) to schedule the claw truck for a special pick-up on Thursday. If your landscaper comes any time between Friday to Tuesday, ask them to take the waste or ask them to place it by your house, then you will move it to the curb for Friday pick up. There should be no yard waste at the curb except on Wednesday or Thursday for Friday pick up.

- Bring in all loose outdoor items (patio furniture, decorations, trash cans, etc.). Storing them inside your home or in your garage will prevent them from being blown away.
- Protect your home's electrical system so you don't end up losing thousands of dollars in replacing appliances.
- Cover your windows. Install hurricane panels (ARC Request) or cover windows with 5%-inch thick plywood to protect them from breaking. Add a deadbolts to your doors to make them more secure against hurricane-force winds.
- Keep the gas tank in your car and a backup full. It's not uncommon for gas stations to run out of gas before a hurricane hits.
- Secure your AC with hurricane straps. Bolting your AC down with metal straps will make sure it won't go anywhere during the storm.

NEIGHBORHOOD Preparing For Hurricanes With Crime Prevention In Mind (courtesy of local Law Enforcement)

The opportunity for crimes to occur after a disaster, such as a hurricane, can

increase if we don't take a few steps of prevention.

Assess your home for vulnerable areas:

- Do a walk through of your home and property to evaluate roof, windows, garage doors and landscaping to determine what actions you may need to take.
- Keep in mind tree limbs close to the home that could break windows; window locks that are

loose; door jams that are weak and sliding glass doors without additional locks.

#### Secure Your Home:

Decide what actions need to be taken to protect your family and your property (shutters, tree trimming, additional locks, or window film).

#### Secure Property if Damage Does Occur:

If you sustained damage, take immediate actions by assessing the damage and making arrangements to secure the property, even if it means temporary repairs.

# PEAK STORM SEASON

Residents should be prepared for stormy weather through November 30 when hurricane season ends. A detailed list of storm tips can be found on ashtonliving.net and at the Clubhouse Activities Desk.

Pay attention to the lightning detection devices throughout the community and seek shelter when the sirens sound.
